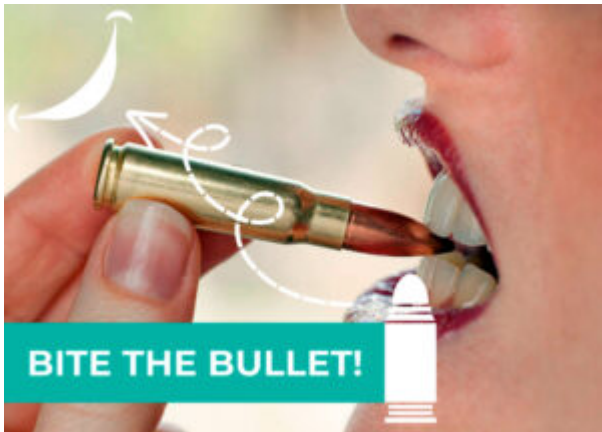


BITE THE BULLET!
