## **Every and their**

"*Every*" is singular (as in Spanish), as is everything, everybody, and everyone.

## However, you may have heard the following:

• "Every student must bring their books to school" and "everyone must pay their taxes in Tenerife".

## These two sentences are incorrect.

In these two examples, the speaker has confused the pronoun "their". In English it is a **plural pronoun,** not singular.

"Every" is third person (la tercera persona) and singular.

## So the correct forms are:

• "everyone must pay his taxes in Tenerife" and "every student must bring his book to school".
